## Abbeydore

A pressure washer was stolen from the yard of a farm in the village sometime between 2.30 - 3.30pm on Wednesday 6th November. The yard was visited during that time by a male in a white Ford transit van **BN59\*YE** who was asking for scrap. Enquiries are in hand with the owner of that vehicle.

## Cusop

A lorry was stolen from the rear yard of a business premises at around 1.30pm on Thursday 7th November. A member of staff saw the vehicle being driven through town, and alerted the police. The vehicle was recovered a short distance away and two males were arrested in connection with the theft. Enquiries are ongoing.

## Dorstone

A report was received yesterday that on Saturday morning 9th November 3 scrambler bikes were seen riding in the private woods at Mynyddbrith; there is no better description - the riders were wearing full face helmets and scarves round their lower face area.

## Longtown

A large outbuilding in a yard was broken into sometime overnight on Tuesday 5th/ Wednesday 6th November and a Stihl hedge trimmer was stolen. The doors were well secured and attempts to gain entry that way were unsuccessful - the offenders

removed a few pieces of wood to make a hole big enough to get through and back out again, and were unable to take any of the larger items from the shed.
