Crime Trends

Bredwardine

Overnight on Saturday 19th/Sunday 20th October approximately 1500 litres of heating oil were stolen from a tank at a domestic property. <u>Incident ref 215-s-211013</u>

A locked barn at a rural location was broken into between 8pm on Friday 18th and 8am on Sunday 20th October, and a quantity of power tools including a Husqvarna chainsaw and a Makita angle grinder were

Longtown

Sometime in the past three weeks a quantity of red diesel was stolen from a tank in an isolated field near the village. <u>Incident ref 191-s-251013</u>

Between 9am on Thursday 17th and 8am on Friday 18th October, a new barn in an isolated location was entered and two new galvanised water tanks were stolen - the barn was empty apart from three tanks, and had not been locked. The scenes of crime officer took images of a number of footprints that had been left by the offenders. Enquiries are continuing.

An incident of sheep worrying occurred at a farm on Tuesday 22nd October, five lambs were seriously injured and needed treatment by a vet. The dog was seen at 1.30pm that day with the sheep, it is a smallish collie-type black dog which would have had blood and sheep's wool in it's mouth when it got home. It is believed to be from the local area and has been seen at night in fields with sheep. Last month five sheep on the same farm were killed by a dog, believed to be the same one. The vet that attended said that the way the sheep were attacked leads to concerns that the dog could seriously injure a child, so please, if you have any idea where this dog comes from, let us

know.

However, the same cannot be said for the grass which is being driven on by idiots in their cars.. We have been patrolling the area on a very regular basis, but obviously cannot be there all the time. We are relying on local residents to call in if they see anything going on that shouldn't be, at any time of the day or night.

Also, the area is an alcohol free zone, but empty bottles and cans are being left there, so, again, please ring in if you see anyone drinking there.
