

# Police Briefing Sunday 30th June 2013

## South Herefordshire & Golden Valley

### Abbeydore

A 55 year old male from the village was arrested for providing a positive breath test at 7.50pm on Friday 21st June in the village. He is on police bail.

### Bredwardine

It has been brought to the attention of the local policing team that recently a memorial stone placed by the river near Bredwardine bridge, has on several occasions had a sign placed over it tied with string. In addition to this the planted flowers at the base of the stone have been removed. As we are sure you can appreciate, this has caused the family great distress.

If you have any information please inform the local policing team by ringing 101 and if you are the culprit please desist immediately.

### Clehonger

Between 10.30 and 10.40pm on Wednesday 19th June, the drivers side wing mirror of a Nissan Micra was snapped off while it was parked outside the owners house in Birchill Road. The vehicle was parked with the mirror on the pavement side, so it was not caused by a passing vehicle.

### Dinedor

A white LDV convoy pick up **V521EUX** with three male occupants was seen this morning (Sunday 30th) at 9.40am travelling through the village having a good look around. There appeared to be scrap in the rear of the truck - a letter will be sent asking for the production of a Waste Carriers Licence. ### Holme Lacy

Two very old misericords ( a small wooden shelf on the underside of a folding seat in a church) were stolen from St Cuthbert's Church sometime between 5th May and 11th June. St Cuthbert's is a redundant church but is open to visitors. The misericords were made of oak with carvings on them and are thought to be quite valuable.

### Little Dewchurch

A 31 year old male from the village was arrested for providing a positive breath test at 12.45am on Saturday 22nd June. He has been charged with the offence and bailed to appear in court. He was also in possession of a small amount of cannabis for which he received a caution.

### Longtown

On Monday 24th June, between 1pm and 11pm a shed at the rear of a property just on the edge of the village was broken into and a Stihl chainsaw and disc cutter, and an Alpine chainsaw were stolen. A quantity of fuel had been siphoned from the tank of a quad bike which was also in the shed. The padlock to the shed had been cut off, and it is believed the offenders came across fields at the rear. Incident ref 98-s-250613

### Madley

Overnight on Thursday 20th/Friday 21st June, a Lister sheep shearing machine and head, 40 metre electric cable/reel, knapsack sprayer, foot rot shears and dagging shears were stolen from a farmyard near Canon Bridge. The items had been left behind a barn, out of view but not secured.

## Young Good Citizen Awards

The Young Good Citizen Award Scheme is run by West Mercia Police in partnership with the High Sheriffs of Shropshire and Worcestershire and Herefordshire. It aims to acknowledge and celebrate the achievements of young people in the community, that might otherwise go unrecognised. Previous young good citizen achievements have included outstanding fund-raising activities and exemplary unselfishness in their attitude towards others.

If you know such a young person, why not nominate them for this year's award? We are particularly keen to hear about young people who have overcome challenges in their own lives and have still been able to make a difference to others in their community.

Each nominee will be awarded a certificate recognising their achievements and they may also be nominated for the overall Young Good Citizen of the Year award, which will be presented at an Award Evening at Force Headquarters, Hindlip Hall, in October.

Chief Constable David Shaw, who has personally championed the awards, says: "These awards are given in recognition of young people making the difference in their communities. Too often our society focuses on the negative issues associated with young people, such as under-age drinking and anti-social behaviour, but the reality is that the positive contributions made by numerous young people far outweigh the problems caused by the few.

"The Young Good Citizen Award is important to West Mercia Police and very close to my heart because for a number of years now the award has highlighted the exceptional contribution that many young people make to local communities across West Mercia."

### **How Can I Nominate Someone?**

We need your help to find young people aged 18 or under, who have demonstrated their commitment to helping others and making the difference in the community either:

- a. individually
- b. through an individual contribution to a group activity
- c. through actively supporting a group activity

They may have helped family, or friends or other members of a wider community as a result of their own initiative or an organised activity.

All you have to do is go onto our website ([www.westmercia.police.uk/goodcitizen/](http://www.westmercia.police.uk/goodcitizen/)) download, print out and fill in the form, explaining how you think this young person has demonstrated their help for others. We are happy to accept nominations of SMALL groups (maximum three people) - just fill in three forms and staple together.

Return your completed nomination to the address on the form - remember that when you propose a young person you must first obtain their parent/guardian's permission and signature.

**The closing date for nominations is Friday, 12 July 2013.**
