

Police Briefing Tuesday 19th February 2013

South Herefordshire & Golden Valley

Good afternoon I hope that you are all enjoying the sunshine, I have heard its not due to last so make the most of it!

Thank you all for the feedback I received last week I have made the requested changes I hope you all approve.

Clehonger

A tractor in the Clehonger area was emptied of approximately 60 litres of white diesel when it was left in an orchard behind the owners house overnight Friday 15th February and Saturday 16th February. Incident number 71n160213.

Craswall

Approximately 1000 litres of domestic heating oil was stolen from a locked tank in the Craswall area between 17:00 on Saturday 9th February and 08:00 on Friday 15th February. The lock and chain was broken off the tank and the fuel siphoned off. The resident of the property recalls hearing their dog barking but did not investigate. Incident Number 252s150213.

Eaton Bishop

Between 13:00 on Saturday 09 February and 08:30 on Sunday 10 February a metal garage door was forced and a motorcycle stolen from Pulley Avenue. The motorcycle was pushed away from the scene and then loaded onto a vehicle. This area is a busy estate with many houses It would have been pushed past many properties before it reached the road. Garway

Overnight on the 17th and 18th February 2013 a resident had a steam cleaner stolen from an insecure outbuilding near to his property. The thieves pushed the steam cleaner down the road and then loaded unit into a vehicle/trailer, that was parked in a gateway close to the house. Incident number 209s180213.

Madley

Four lorries parked up in an industrial estate in madley have had their fuel emptied for the second time. The culprits have entered the site through a broken part of the fence, siphoned the fuel out, replaced the caps and left leaving no damage. This happened between Friday 8th February and Sunday 10th February. Incident number 321s100213.

Tyberton

On the 17th February three local males, aged between 18 and 25 had a severe talking to after two armed response units responded to a call from a local farmer who had poachers on his land.

All the owners or insured parties of these vehicles have been sent one of our letters requesting they account for the vehicle being seen in suspicious circumstances. We have had one reply so far he was not happy that we were looking into why his vehicle was in our area, but did account for his movements.
